

GCLAW SERVICE TERMS & CONDITIONS

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1. Gclaw Service

- 1.1. Subject to Customer’s compliance with these Terms, the MSA, and any applicable documentation, Gcore will provide Customer with the Gclaw Service. The Gclaw Service is a solution allowing Customers of Gcore to launch AI agents instantly, with managed inference. References to the “Services” in the MSA include the Gclaw Service to the extent it is used by the Customer. Any Gcore responsibilities, obligations or liabilities with respect to the Gclaw Service will not apply to any associated Third Party Products, including as specified below.
- 1.2. The Gclaw Service allows one-click deployment of an AI agent and large language model (“**LLM**”) with built-in inference powered by Gcore’s own GPU infrastructure, e.g. virtual machine (“**VM**”). Currently the Gclaw Service provides deployment of the Open Claw AI agent on pre-allocated Gcore virtual machines, and may provide one or more LLMs, such as DeepSeek-V4-Flash.

2. Third Party Products

- 2.1. OpenClaw, DeepSeek-v4-Flash, and any other integrated third-party AI agents, models or LLMs are Third Party Products within the meaning of the MSA. Any software, skills, scripts, configurations or tools installed by or via an AI agent are also Third Party Products within the meaning of the MSA.
- 2.2. Customer is solely responsible for evaluating the security of all Third Party Products and complying with any applicable terms or privacy policies (if any) (“**Third Party Product Terms**”).
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- 2.4. Gcore does not promise any particular level of accuracy or quality with respect to OpenClaw’s and/or any third-party AI agent’s or LLM’s behavior or results.

- 2.5. Gcore reserves the right to alter these Terms and the Gclaw Service upon notice, including in a manner that may result in (i) an increase in Fees (if any), and (ii) a decrease of compute capacity, memory, and/or storage capacity or resources.

3. Input and Output

- 3.1. Where the Gclaw Service enables Customer to input, provide, or submit prompts, instructions, URLs, or other materials (“**Input**”) into the AI agent or LLM for processing, and thus direct the Gclaw Service to generate the content, designs, other assets, or perform certain actions in response to Customer’s Input (“**Output**”), the Input submitted by Customer and the Output generated through the Gclaw Service are “Customer Content” within the meaning of MSA. Gcore does not claim any ownership rights in the Customer Content provided that the Output does not contain any preexisting intellectual property owned by Gcore. Output may not be unique and may be similar or identical to content generated by third parties. For the avoidance of doubt, any processing of Customer Content by Gcore is carried out for the purpose of providing the Gclaw Service in accordance with the MSA and applicable DPA.
- 3.2. To the extent Customer uses any Third Party Products, any processing of Customer Content through such Third Party Products is carried out solely on Customer’s instructions and under Customer’s responsibility. Gcore does not initiate, direct, or control any interaction between Customer and such Third Party Products. Third Party Products and their providers are not subprocessors of Gcore, and Gcore acts solely as an infrastructure provider in connection with their use by Customer.
- 3.3. Customer is solely responsible for reviewing the Output for accuracy and bias, and ensuring that all Input and Output complies with applicable law, including any third party privacy or intellectual property rights. Customer should not rely on Output from the Gclaw Service as a sole source of truth or factual information, or as a substitute for professional advice. Customer further acknowledges that Output may contain content inconsistent with Gcore's views.

4. Gcore Security. By default:

- 4.1. When OpenClaw runs in Docker, it is placed in an isolated Docker network, and
- 4.2. Gcore enables sandbox mode to prevent malicious or compromised prompts from accessing Customer’s system or network.

5. Customer Obligations

- 5.1. Customer is solely responsible for Inputs, Outputs, and the use and actions of any Third Party Products deployed within the Gclaw Service. Customer is wholly responsible for any acts or omissions of its AI agents, whether unintentional or unauthorized, that, if taken by Customer, would constitute a violation of these Terms, the MSA, or any applicable documentation.
- 5.2. Given the nature of the Gclaw Service, Customer must (a) have backups of any data AI agents can access, including Customer Data and Customer Content; and (b) continuously monitor all AI agent usage, including the actions of AI agents.
- 5.3. Customer must implement and maintain appropriate security controls, including but not limited to:
 - 5.3.1. Restricting direct messaging policies to explicitly allow only the users, roles, or actions needed. Customer will ensure wildcard or “allow all” rules in production environments are not allowed;

- 5.3.2. Protecting credentials, tokens, secrets and API keys; Customer will ensure they and any other sensitive files have strict permissions;
- 5.3.3. Defending against prompt injection. All external input must be treated as untrusted. Untrusted content must be wrapped in explicit “untrusted” boundaries and must not be allowed to directly influence command execution or tool invocation;
- 5.3.4. Blocking dangerous commands for OpenClaw tasks. At a minimum, Customer must explicitly block destructive or irreversible commands such as recursive deletes, forced git pushes, shell piping, or arbitrary network calls;
- 5.3.5. Preventing OpenClaw’s access to unrelated services, internal services, databases, or management interfaces;
- 5.3.6. Limiting tool permissions. Only enable the MCP tools that OpenClaw will actually need. Customers should avoid granting broad or elevated tool access as that can would violate the principle of least privilege and increase security risks. Customer must review tool permissions regularly;
- 5.3.7. Enabling audit and session logging to detect security incidents (if any). Comprehensive session and action logging must be enabled to track what OpenClaw executes, when it runs, and who triggered it; and
- 5.3.8. Securing pairing and access codes to prevent brute-force attempts.

6. Acceptable Use

- 6.1. In addition to the restrictions in the AUP, Customer may not use Gclaw Service, nor allow AI agents, End Users or any third party to use the Gclaw Service for the following:
 - (a) child sexual abuse material;
 - (b) child exploitation and abuse;
 - (c) sexual deepfakes;
 - (d) activity related to personally identifiable information;
 - (e) identifying persons or infer private or sensitive info about a person;
 - (f) reproducing someone’s likeness or voice without their consent;
 - (g) providing legal, medical or other advice or services without a license;
 - (h) automated decision-making processes with legal effects;
 - (i) emotion and facial recognition;
 - (j) deceptive activity; or
 - (k) prompt injection, jailbreaking, or taking any other adversarial action designed to compromise any AI agents, models, LLMs or Third Party Products without prior written permission from Gcore

- 6.2. Gcore reserves the right to screen any Input sent for inference and Output (without the obligation to do so), and to decide whether it complies with any applicable documentation, these Terms, or the MSA. Gcore may suspend use of the Gclaw Service for any such violation. The Glaw Service is not designed for use in high-risk or safety-critical environments.
7. **Fees.** Customer will pay to Gcore all Fees incurred on Customer's account in connection with the Gclaw Service in accordance with the pricing indicated on the Website or as otherwise notified by Gcore, including by e-mail notification. Where use of the Gclaw Service by Customer exceeds any volume limitations (if any), Gcore may charge Customer additional Fees for all data traffic (the sum of data that is transmitted to and from Customer's infrastructure, measured in bytes) generated in connection with the Gclaw Service. Gclaw is provided under a spot tariff model.
